The Buffalo, IA City Council met in regular session on Monday, February 07, 1994, at 7:00 p.m. at City Hall with Mayor Phil Hoover presiding. Present were councilmembers Josie Collins, Tom Harland, Jr., David Kinsinger, Dick Nissen and Betty Walters. Absent, none.

Motion by Walters and Collins to approve the previous minutes of January 03 and 10. All ayes. Carried.

Motion by Walters and Harland to approve the bills. All ayes. Carried.

Motion by Walters and Kinsinger to approve the Treasurers report. All ayes. Carried. Receipts were \$54,304.58 and disbursements were \$66,687.57 for January.

Motion by Kinsinger and Walters to approve Resolution #10-94, "A RESOLUTION TO INCREASE MILEAGE RATE." All ayes. Carried.

Motion by Collins and Nissen to approve Resolution #11-94, "A RESOLUTION FOR TAX DEPOSITS TO BE SENT TO THE BUFFALO SAVINGS BANK." All ayes. Carried.

Motion by Walters and Harland to approve Resolution #12-94, "A RESOLUTION TO INCREASE THE RECYCLE FEE." All ayes. Carried. This will increase to \$1.50 to cover past cost increases and expected increases this year.

Motion by Harland and Kinsinger to approve Resolution #13-94, "A RESOLUTION ADOPTING AMENDED ARTICLES OF AGREEMENT OF THE BI-STATE REGIONAL COMMISSION." All ayes. Carried.

Motion by Collins and Walters to approve the first reading of Ordinance #301, "AN ORDINANCE FOR CURFEW." Voting yes were Collins, Harland, Kinsinger, Nissen and Walters. Voting no, none. Carried. This will be on the next agenda for approval.

Motion by Kinsinger and Walters to approve the request for renewal of a five year lease contract with Lafarge for City Park. All ayes. Carried.

Motion by Kinsinger and Collins to approve Bernauer and Walters and Mayor, if he wishes to go, to the IMFOA meeting in April and October. All ayes. Carried.

Rick Fielders arbitration decision was tabled until the next meeting.

Motion by Kinsinger and Harland to approve the retaining of City Attorney Mark Cleve and a rate increase of \$10.00 per hour. All ayes. Carried. A letter will be sent to the three applicants who applied for this position.

Motion by Walters and Nissen to get an appraisal and advertise for bids, with the right to accept or reject any or all bids, for the lot owned by the city on Ash Street. All ayes. Carried.

Motion by Walters and Nissen to approve the police report as given by Gage Adams. All ayes. Carried.

Motion by Walters and Kinsinger to approve the purchase of a new squad car with a bid of \$14,033.50 from Dahl, plus a new cage, light bar, striping. All ayes. Carried. The price with the extras will be approximately \$16,000.00


The public works report was given by Ralph Jewett. Motion by Walters and Nissen to approve Jewett using his own discretion as to when his men should attend the monthly safety meetings around the county area. All ayes. Carried. A price for a new water tower was given at over \$340,000. Motion by Nissen and Walters to hire Schemmer Assoc. as the City Engineer. All ayes. Carried. A new storage building was briefly discussed.

Protecs report was given by Tim McCleary. There was much discussion of Protecs not turning in any receipts for the \$333.33 expense money they were approved for each month. Mayor Hoover said he wants the originals but then said he wants copies of the original receipts clear back to April of 1992 when they were hired since we haven't received any receipts for this \$333.33 monthly expense fee. Mayor Hoover said Protecs is also to give City Hall copies of all Dept. of Natural Resources reports, of which we have none. A water/sewer committee meeting will be 2/23/94 at 6:00 p.m. at City Hall.

Mayors report was given. He said the city will apply for the summer JTPA program and for a supervisor paid for by them. He described the Adopt-A-Road program for county roads, told of a meeting with Linwood Mining at City Hall on 2/28 at 7:00 p.m. and that Lafarge Corp. will have a program tomorrow night at the Community Center on their tire burning program. Linwood wants Buffalo to reissue 2.4 million dollars of their industrial development revenue bonds for a lower interest rate than they have now. The Community Center report was given by Bev Myers. She said they are still in need of more members on the Board.

Community input was given by Leota Buffington, Bev Myers, Josie Collins and Carol Bernauer.

Motion by Nissen and Harland to adjourn the meeting at 9:20 p.m. All ayes. Carried.
