

March 07, 1994¹⁴

The Buffalo City Council met in regular session on Monday, March 07, 1994, at 7:00 p.m. at City Hall with Mayor Phil Hoover presiding. Present were Councilmembers Josie Collins, Tom Harland, Jr., David Kinsinger, Dick Nissen. Absent, Betty Walters.

Motion by Harland and Kinsinger to approve the previous minutes. All present aye. Carried.

Motion by Kinsinger and Harland to suspend the rules and waive the second and third reading of Ordinance #301, "CURFEW ORDINANCE" and adopt the ordinance, to become effective immediately after publication. Voting yes were Collins, Harland, Nissen and Kinsinger. Absent, Walters. Motion carried.

Motion by Kinsinger and Collins to approve Resolution #18-94, "A RESOLUTION OF COMMITTEES." All present voted aye. Carried.

Larry Hamer, owner of the Beach Pub, asked council for permission to install permanent poles for volleyball tournaments on the Buffalo River Park Beach. The Beach Pub would sponsor the tournaments, rent out nets and balls to individuals at other times with a deposit. There was discussion of liability if someone is injured. This will be checked into with the City's insurance carrier and his also. Motion by Harland and Collins to table this request until the April 04 meeting. All present voted aye. Carried. Larry also complimented the city workers on snow removal the past month.

Motion by Nissen and Harland to approve the bills after discussion of procedure of purchasing supplies for the software program. At the present time, the clerks are not allowed to purchase directly from the state supplier, but must purchase everything thru the software salesmen. This was not agreed to in the software contract. All voted aye. Carried. The purchase procedure will be changed.

Motion by Collins and Nissen to approve the Treasurers report. Receipts for the month of February were \$91,639.59 and disbursements were \$79,311.13. All present aye. Carried.

Ralph Jewett gave a Public Works report. He gave a progress report on his new office being made inside the Morton building and asked permission to install carpeting in it. Council told him to get prices. Motion by Kinsinger and Harland to approve the County striping our four rural area roads this summer for approximately \$739.00. All present aye. Carried. Motion by Nissen and Harland to extend the street contract with M.S.I. for the same prices as last year. All present voted aye. Carried. Motion by Kinsinger and Collins to pass over Rick Fielders request to attend wastewater classes and approve Dwain Bollman to attend a Grade 2 water class. All present voted aye. Carried. Mayor reported on information from Schemmer Associates on a new water tower project that was discussed at a committee meeting.

Gage Adams gave a police report. There was discussion of the "Neighborhood Watch" program and "Drug Free" zones.

After great discussion, motion was made by Kinsinger and Harland to approve Jeff Swanson going to an E.M.S. class in Des Moines, paying his wages and expenses for three days, and an officer to cover for him. All present voted aye. Carried.

Protecs gave a report. They will submit copies of all D.N.R. reports and receipts each month around the 15th.

Committee reports were asked for. Collins reported on the sewer/water meeting, and Harland discussed a park program for this summer. This will be checked further.

No one was present to give a park board report. Bev Myers gave a Community Center report. Mayor Hoover gave a report, including a grant request for riverboat gambling profits. Community input was received from Kenny Bernauer, Bev Myers, Wilma Firrell and Carol Bernauer. Motion by Kinsinger and Nissen to adjourn the meeting at 8:56 p.m. All present voted aye. Carried.
