The Buffalo, IA City Council met in regular session on Monday, April 03, 1995, 7:01 p.m. at City Hall with Mayor Phil Hoover presiding. Present were Councilmembers Tom Harland, Jr., Dave Kinsinger and Betty Walters. Absent were Josie Collins and Dick Nissen.

Motion by Walters and Kinsinger to approve the previous months minutes. All present aye. Carried.

Motion by Kinsinger and Harland to approve the listed bills. All ayes. Carried.

Motion by Harland and Walters to approve Resolution #20-95, "A RESOLUTION SETTING MAY 01, 1995, 7:00 P.M. FOR A PUBLIC HEARING TO AMEND THE CURRENT FISCAL 1994-95 BUDGET." Voting yes were Harland, Kinsinger and Walters. Absent, Collins and Nissen. Motion carried.

Motion by Harland and Kinsinger to approve renewal of the Beach Pub's Class "C" liquor license, and Sunday permit. All present aye. Carried.

Motion by Walters and Kinsinger to approve the Treasurers report as presented. For the month of March, receipts were \$71,724.41 and disbursements were \$82,755.04. All present voted aye. Carried.

Motion by Walters and Harland to approve Resolution #21-95, "A RESOLUTION FOR REWARD FOR INFORMATION LEADING TO ARREST AND CONVICTION OF ANYONE VANDALIZING CITY PROPERTY." Voting yes were Harland, Walters and Kinsinger. Absent, Collins and Nissen. Carried.

The public works report was given by Dwain Bollman, Director. Council approved to pay Larry Sexton \$10.00 per hour on an as-needed basis. He discussed a water seminar at Tipton, purchase of some property at the West well site, water rates and lift station progress. The water-sewer committee will meet to discuss rates. Bernauer suggested using the funds from the landfill to pay for the water project. Council said to check into it. Motion by Kinsinger and Walters to have the County do the pavement marking for our rural streets as quoted for \$837.26. All present voted aye. Carried.

The police report was given by Gage Adams. Council agreed that since Swanson has resigned, Jackson should be brought up to Swansons position with a rank and payrate increase. This is usually done within the department. There was discussion of autos driving at high speeds in the 800 and 900 blocks of 4th Street. There will be more patrol in this area.

The Community Center report was given by Rick Fielder. He has received three resignations and has four new commission members to have approved. Motion by Kinsinger and Harland to approve Resolution #22-95, "A RESOLUTION APPOINTING FOUR NEW COMMISSION MEMBERS." All present voted yes. Absent, Collins and Nissen. Carried.

The park board report was given by Harland. He inquired why the mulch pile couldn't be used instead of sand in the park under equipment? The mulch is not "clean", but has thorns and other materials in it that could be harmful. Council approved some of our stockpile of railroad ties to replace the present poles and ties around the parking lot at the City Park.

There was no one present to give a Buffalo Days report or a Protec report.

The street committee will meet to go over the list of future street improvements.

Mayor Hoover gave his report. He reported on the status of our landfill funds we are to receive, a meeting that was held here with the Iowa Emergency Management Division and several property owners affected by the flood and other meetings he has been attending.

Motion by Kinsinger and Harland to approve Resolution #23-95, "A RESOLUTION FOR EACH CITY WHICH IS A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION." All present voted yes. Absent, Collins and Nissen. Motion carried.

No dates for special meetings were set. Community input was asked for. Walters told of an additional check that was received in the past couple days from the lumber mill

in Jay, Maine, that contributed so much money donated by their employees. This was another check for \$2,445.00. It will be put into the flood fund for future use. Bollman has assembled a sample sheet of water that is wasted daily in many ways. This will be distributed to the residents of Buffalo in the near future. Harland discussed plans to hold an Easter Egg hunt. Motion by Kinsinger and Walters to adjourn the meeting at 8:01 p.m. All present voted yes. Absent, Collins and Nissen. Motion was carried.
