The Buffalo, IA City Council met in regular session on Monday, August 07, 1995, at 7:02 p.m. at City Hall with Mayor Phil Hoover presiding. Present were Councilmembers Tom Harland, Jr., Dave Kinsinger, Dick Nissen and Betty Walters. Absent, Josie Collins.

Motion by Harland and Kinsinger to approve the previous months minutes. All ayes. Carried.

Motion by Walters and Kinsinger to approve the Treasurers report. Receipts for July were \$56,419.73 and disbursements were \$133,104.62. All present voted aye. Motion carried.

Motion by Harland and Walters to approve the bills as listed. All present aye. Carried.

Mayor Hoover presented Certificates of Appreciation to the Buffalo Days Committee for their successful 1995 event. Certificates were issued to Holly Lopez, Ron Lopez, Laura Christ and Jackie Guldenpfennig. Certificates will also be given to Jamie Brooks and Tai Brooks for their participation on the Committee.

Appreciation awards were also made for Lafarge Corp. and Doug Buchanan, Plant Manager.

Motion by Walters and Kinsinger to have the regular September council meeting on Monday, September 11, due to Labor Day. All present aye. Carried.

An amendment to the animal ordinance will be drawn up to include cats. Walters will have an ordinance committee meeting for this.

Motion by Kinsinger and Harland to approve Resolution #45-95, "A RESOLUTION OF AGREEMENT FOR COOPERATIVE TRANSPORTATION PLANNING AND PROGRAMMING" with Bi-State. All present voted yes. Absent, Collins, Motion carried.

Item #11, REAP grant funds application, was tabled by Mayor Hoover.

Dwain Bollman was not present to give his public works report. Council discussed a letter to be drafted to the Iowa State Attorney Generals office concerning the sewer plant. Motion by Kinsinger and Walters that the council approve the letter to be drawn up by the Public Works Director, after they have read it, and then have Attorney Davidson check it before its sent. All present aye. Carried.

Gage Adams was not present to give his police report. Mayor Hoover reported on some police items. Purchase of police vests were discussed. Rob Jackson is requesting a new one, as the last one purchased is several years old. After discussion, motion was made by Kinsinger and Walters to purchase the requested one for Jackson only, and it must be worn all times that he is on duty, no exceptions. All present voted aye. Motion carried.

The vacancy on the police department was discussed. Motion by Kinsinger and Harland to temporarily hire, pending another interview with council on August 09, Brian Sanger for the vacancy. He and another applicant were the other two final applicants for the vacancy three months ago when it was filled. Sanger will be interviewed on August 09 at 7:00 p.m. at City Hall. Voting aye were Harland, Kinsinger and Walters. Opposed, Nissen. Absent, Collins. Motion carried. He would have a six months probation period after he starts the job.

Motion by Harland and Walters to approve Resolution #46-96, "A RESOLUTION FOR APPLICATION FOR RIVERBOAT GAMBLING FUNDS." All present voted yes. Carried.

The Buffalo Days report will be given at the September meeting by the committee.


