The Buffalo, IA City Council met in regular session on Monday, September 11, 1995, at 7:02 p.m. at City Hall with Mayor Phil Hoover presiding. Present were Councilmembers Josie Collins, Tom Harland, Jr., Dave Kinsinger and Betty Walters. Absent, Dick Nissen.

Motion by Walters and Kinsinger to approve the previous months minutes. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motion by Walters and Harland to approve the treasurers report. Receipts for August were 89,373.34 and disbursements were 107,201.37. All ayes. Carried.

Motion by Harland and Kinsinger to approve the bills as listed. All ayes. Carried.

Motion by Walters and Harland to approve Resolution #48-95, "A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE FISCAL 1994-95 IOWA D.O.T. FINANCIAL REPORT FOR CITY STREETS & PARKING AS REQUIRED BY THE IOWA D.O.T." All present yes. Carried.

Motion by Harland and Collins to approve Resolution #49-95, "A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE FISCAL 1994-95 FINANCIAL REPORT AS REQUIRED BY THE STATE OF IOWA." All present yes. Motion carried.

Motion by Walters and Kinsinger to approve the first reading of Ordinance #308 "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 111, CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE 2, "DOGS" OF THE CITY CODE OF BUFFALO IA TO INCLUDE DOMESTIC CATS." Voting to approve were Collins, Harland, Kinsinger and Walters. Absent, Nissen. Motion carried. Motion by Kinsinger and Collins to waive the second and third readings and adopt Ordinance #308. Voting yes were Collins, Harland, Kinsinger and Walters. Absent, Nissen. Motion carried. The ordinance will become effective September 18, upon publication as required by law.

Motion by Harland and Kinsinger to approve Resolution #50-95, "A RESOLUTION APPROVING ROY HARPERS FIFTH ADDITION TO VILLAGE OAKS." All present voted yes. Carried.

The police report was given by Chief Gage Adams. Walters told him of many complaints to her of reckless driving in the west part of the city. This will be taken care of.

The public works report was given by Dwain Bollman, Director.

Steve Honse, Dale Christenson and David Irish were present from Schemmer Associates to discuss the future water project. This includes a 250,000 gallon water storage tank, a 30' x 40' building, better pressure, and a forced main from well one to well two. Motion by Kinsinger and Harland to approve the purchase of another salter and plow. Also to table the computer program for the public works dept. until the next meeting. All ayes. Carried.

Motion by Kinsinger and Walters to approve Resolution #51-95, "A RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE MAYOR TO ORDER TRAFFIC CONTROL SIGNING MATERIALS FROM THE IOWA DEPT. OF TRANSPORTATION." All yes. Carried.

Mayor Hoover gave his mayors report. He told council about the special census that is presently underway, and other items.

As there has been an offer made on the old tractor backhoe, council decided to accept sealed bids on the equipment until 3:45 p.m. September 20, when it will be awarded at a special meeting.

Motion by Kinsinger and Harland to refuse a request from Charles Van Laarhoven to be given a tax exemption on some property. All ayes. Carried.

Motion by Walters and Kinsinger not to have the county install drain tile along the city portion of 110th Avenue, due to the expense of it. All ayes. Carried.

Walters explained the need for a phone extension in the mealsite room at the civic center. After discussion, motion made by Harland and Walters to have an extension put into the room to answer calls only, and no outgoing calls will be possible, as it will be connected to the pay phone in the lobby. The city workers will install it. All ayes. Carried.

There was discussion of upgrading the phones at city hall. There are two incoming phone lines, but no way to transfer calls or hold calls, etc. This will be checked further.

Robin Guenther of the Park Board, gave council prices for new fixtures to be used in new bathrooms in the park stand building. These new bathrooms will replace the outside vault toilets. These will be stainless steel fixtures, and the restrooms will only be open to the public when the park stand is open, or when someone has the shelters reserved and will be responsible for them. Motion by Walters and Harland to approve the bids. All ayes. Carried. Council also approved the purchase of sheets of plywood or polyurethane sheets to install a tennis backboard wall.

The community center was discussed. Finance reports and bingo nights, an upcoming all-night bingo game, a Christmas party, etc. were discussed.

Jackie Guldenpfennig discussed next years Buffalo Days. The committee will be made up of the following persons to date: Ron and Holly Lopez, Laura Christ, Jackie and Bryon Guldenpfennig. Mayor Hoover told everyone that next year is the State of Iowa's Bicentennial and a parade will be May 25, and he is expecting some floats in it from Buffalo since we are the oldest town in Scott County. The Community Center Relations Committee will meet at the City Hall on Wednesday, Sept. 13, at 9:00 a.m. There will be a special council meeting on Wednesday, September 20, at 6:00 p.m. to decide the type of funding for the special water project and award the bid for the tractor.

There was no community input given. Motion made by Collins and Walters to adjourn the meeting at 8:47 p.m. All present aye. Carried.
