The City Council of Buffalo, IA met in regular session on Monday, October 02, 1995, at 7:00 p.m. at City Hall with Mayor Phil Hoover presiding. Present were Councilmembers Josie Collins, Tom Harland, Jr., Dick Nissen and Betty Walters. Absent, Dave Kinsinger. Motion by Walters and Collins to approve the previous months minutes. All present aye. Motion carried.

Motion by Harland and Collins to approve the Treasurers report. Receipts were \$95,646.00 and disbursements were \$85,602.89. All present aye. Carried.

Motion by Harland and Collins to approve the listed bills. All ayes. Carried.

Motion by Harland and Collins to approve the hours of 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. for Trick or Treat night October 30. All present aye. Carried.

Motion by Harland and Walters to approve Resolution #53-95. All present yes. Carried.

The public works report was given by Dwain Bollman. He discussed the report from the Iowa Commerce Commission on the electric inspection, portable radios for the public works employees instead of vehicle radios, street lights being shot out, drain tiles on 110th Avenue. Walters wants the handicapped insignia painted on the street at City Hall.

Motion by Walters and Harland to approve the County to plow our rural areas this winter season for \$794.17. All present aye. Carried.

Mayors report was given by Mayor Hoover. He discussed drug testing for employees, the life jacket ordinance, which will be on next months agenda, an A.D.A. class he will attend in Des Moines, and the community center.

Discussion was held on the condition of the Dairy Bar building. The building inspector will instruct the owners to board up the windows and doors because of the danger of the glass falling out.

Mayor discussed the alcohol and drug testing program. He told council employees who have a Commercial Drivers License will be subject to testing. This will not involve volunteer firefighters, (unless their full time job requires it at their place of employment), police officers or office. It will be done randomly by a drawing of names by the company that is hired by the council. This will be on the November agenda.

The community center report was given by Linn Kinkennen. Council received a copy of their latest available statement. Mayor Hoover told of a problem the previous week of not having anyone around to let someone into the building. He wants a key available in the future for this type of problem. Motion by Walters and Harland to approve the purchase of a new bingo machine and the trade-in of their old machine. All present voted aye. Carried. There will be an all night bingo on October 14, and another one possibly in January. There will be bingo at least the first two weeks of December this year.

The Park Board report was given by Harland. The new bathrooms are being worked on at the stand, and new doors have been installed. The stand is to be open for all ballgames at the park, no matter who is playing. The boat ramp on Front Street is almost done, as far as the ramp is concerned. The actual dock will be put in later.

Committee reports were asked for. Collins reported she and Walters had toured the wastewater treatment plant when more problems had been found, after the tanks were drained. No special meetings were set for later this month. The police report was given by Gage Adams, Chief of Police. Council approved him to attend the police chiefs conference this month. Community input was asked for. The official census figures are not yet back. Motion by Harland and Collins to adjourn at 8:04 p.m. All present yes. Carried.
