The City Council of Buffalo, IA met in special session on Monday, January 22, 1996, at 6:30 p.m. with Mayor Phil Hoover presiding. Present were Councilmembers Paula Anderson, Tom Harland, Jr., Dave Kinsinger, Kent Roe and Betty Walters. None absent.

Motion by Kinsinger and Roe to award the bid for asbestos removal at 102-104 Franklin Street to Curry Environmental for \$975.00 and to award the bid for demolition of the same address to Rowold Co. for \$4191.00. All voted aye. Motion by Harland and Walters to approve Resolution #06-96. All voted yes. Carried.

Motion by Roe and Kinsinger to table the resolution approving the committees. Voting yes were Anderson, Kinsinger and Roe. Voting no, Harland and Walters. Motion carried.

Motion by Kinsinger and Roe to waive the reading of Resolution #07-96 and adopt it for the water project contract with Schemmer Associates, as all councilmembers have had copies of the contract for a couple of weeks. All voted yes. Carried.

Motion by Kinsinger and Anderson to approve renewal of the Community Center's liquor license. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motion by Harland and Roe to waive the reading of Resolution #08-96, as council has had copies of it, and approve the resolution for a public hearing of the sale of land. All voted yes. Motion carried.

The Council and Mayor had a question and answer session with Clay Thompson. Right now the council is not seeking another city attorney, but will consider him if the position ever opens. No future meetings were scheduled, as the committee list has not been approved. Community input was asked for. Dwain Bollman asked if we have heard anything back from the state on the water rate fees. The committee met on this quite a few months ago, but was tabled by the council after that for more consideration.

Motion by Roe and Kinsinger to adjourn the meeting at 7:33 p.m. All voted yes. Carried.
