

November 03, 1997

The City Council of Buffalo, IA, met on Monday, November 03, 1997, at City Hall at 7:00 p.m. with Mayor Phil Hoover presiding. Present were Councilmembers Paula Anderson, Tom Harland, Jr., and Betty Walters. Absent, Dave Kinsinger and Kent Roe.

Motion by Walters and Anderson to approve the previous months minutes of Oct. 06 and Oct. 13. All present aye. Motion carried.

Motion by Anderson and Harland to approve the listed bills. All present aye. Carried.

Motion by Anderson and Walters to approve the treasurers report. All present aye. Motion carried. Receipts for October were \$221,810.32 and disbursements were \$136,302.17.

Motion by Walters and Harland to approve Resolution #26-97, "Scott County Winter Maintenance Agreement for 1997-98". Voting to approve were Anderson, Harland and Walters. Absent, Kinsinger and Roe. Motion carried.

Motion by Anderson and Walters to approve the first reading of Ordinance #353, "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE VIII, CHAPTER I, ARTICLE I, STREET REGULATIONS". Voting yes were Anderson, Harland and Walters. Absent were Roe and Kinsinger. Motion carried. Motion made by Anderson and Walters to suspend the rules and waive the second and third readings and adopt the ordinance. Voting yes were Harland, Anderson and Walters. Absent, Kinsinger and Roe. Motion carried.

Motion by Anderson and Walters to approve the first reading of Ordinance #354, "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE VI, CHAPTER 7, ARTICLE 2, (6-7.0309(2), "C" TWO FAMILY DWELLING REGULATIONS". Voting yes were Anderson, Harland and Walters. Absent, Roe and Kinsinger. Motion carried. Motion by Anderson and Walters to suspend the rules and waive the second and third readings and adopt the ordinance. Voting yes were Anderson, Harland and Walters. Absent, Kinsinger and Roe. Carried.

Motion by Anderson and Walters to approve the first reading of Ordinance #355, "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE II, DIVISION I, CHAPTER 2, (2.1-2.1016) CONCERNING PARKING IN VIOLATION OF A ZONING ORDINANCE". Voting yes were Anderson, Harland and Walters. Absent, Kinsinger and Roe. Motion carried. Motion by Anderson and Harland to suspend the rules and waive the second and third readings and adopt the ordinance. Voting yes were Anderson, Harland and Walters. Absent, Kinsinger and Roe. Motion carried.

The public works report was given by Dwain Bollman, Director. He reported on the open house at the new water building on November 01; electric service for Apple Hollow; boiler work at the Civic Center; park winterizing; water break on Nov. 02. Steve Honse of Schemmer Associates updated Council on the pay request from the project contractor. As it was just received, Council would not approve anything tonight. There was discussion on the extra rock expense and the retention amount. This was tabled until a future meeting.

There was considerable discussion on the new boat ramp. Council wants assurance it will be designed properly and dropped into the river and stabilized properly. Walters questioned where the financing could come from and usage by our residents. Council will meet on Wednesday, November 05, at 5:30 p.m. to decide on the dock.


The police report was given by Gage Adams, Chief of Police. He told Council there was no vandalism reported during Halloween and no problems during Trick or Treat.


Councilmembers reported on the Park Board and Community Center. Volunteers and/or more Commission members are needed at the Community Center to keep it operating.

Mayor Hoover gave his Mayors report. He said he was incorrectly quoted on the news item concerning the time frame for repairs on the water project. Committee reports were asked for. There will be a special senior citizens meal and bingo at the

Community Center on November 15. No other dates were set for special meetings. Public input was asked for. There was quite a discussion on volunteers needed for youth events to happen in our city. More parents or interested adults need to organize to have a place for youth to go, similar to when they could go to the youth room in the basement at the civic center. Due to lack of volunteers, there isn't a youth center anymore.

Motion made by Anderson and Walters to adjourn the meeting at 8:07 p.m. All present voted yes. Absent, Kinsinger and Roe. Motion carried.
