

April 14, 1998

The City Council of Buffalo, IA, met in special session on Tuesday, April 14, 1998, at City Hall with Mayor Betty Walters presiding. Present were Councilmembers Paula Anderson, Mitch Greer, Bill Sheeder and Ted Teel. Tom Harland, Jr., arrived at approximately 6:18 p.m.

Motion made by Greer and Anderson to approve Resolution #18-98, "A RESOLUTION APPROVING BRYAN LITTLE FOR THE CITY PARK CONCESSION STAND FOR 1998." After discussion about certain requirements, a roll call vote was yes by Anderson, Greer, Sheeder and Teel. Absent, Harland. Motion carried.

Motion by Greer and Teel, to accept the resignations of Don Moses and Betty Moses from the Park Board. All present voted aye. Motion carried. These were turned in April 06.

Motion by Anderson and Teel to approve Resolution #19-98, "A RESOLUTION FOR APPOINTMENT TO THE BUFFALO PARK BOARD." The appointment is for Judy Hammons. Voting yes were Anderson, Teel, Sheeder and Greer. Absent, Harland. Carried. There was discussion of another appointment, but the park board has not approved the other person yet. The park board will meet at City Hall on Wednesday, April 29 at 6:00 p.m. and consider the appointment at that time.

The Ordinance Committee will meet at City Hall on April 22 at 6:00 p.m. There will be a special council meeting on April 27 at 5:30 p.m.

As one of the applicants for the park stand arrived, discussion was held about the requirements of insurance and background check. As Bryan Little was not present, the other person on the bid was Natasha Seager. She agreed to the same requirements. Motion was then made by Greer and Anderson to withdraw their motions to the previous Resolution #18-98. Motion was then made by Greer and Anderson to approve Resolution #18-98, approving Natasha Seager for the park stand in 1998, with the necessary requirements as stated earlier. Voting yes were Anderson, Harland, Greer, Sheeder and Teel. Motion carried.

Public input was asked for. Harland said he cannot attend meetings on Tuesday and Thursday before 7:00 p.m. Discussion was held on the nuisance abatement letters that have been sent to property owners and renters. Approximately 60 of these have been mailed so far, with about a third of the city to be checked for this. The form letters that are mailed out are signed "Mayor and City Council" as the Council passes the ordinances that are contained in the City Code book. Mayor Walters said the remaining part of the City will be checked some time next week. There have been compliments and complaints both, but the remaining area will be checked.

Motion made by Harland and Sheeder to adjourn the meeting at 6:33 p.m. All voted aye. Motion carried.
