

June 19, 1999

The City Council of Buffalo, Iowa, met on Saturday, June 19, 1999, at 10:05 a.m. at City Hall with Mayor Betty Walters presiding. Present were Councilmembers Todd Adams, Mitch Greer, Kent Roe, Bill Sheeder and Ted Teel. None absent.

Purpose of the special meeting was to discuss and decide on an ordinance for the Buffalo River Park. City Attorney Bill McCullough had put together an ordinance for certain items of caution and increased fines for certain violations at the Buffalo River Park and the Ordinance Committee had met on June 17 and many of the citizens were present to give their views on the ordinance. After discussion, motion was made by Roe and seconded by Teel to approve the first reading of Ordinance #363. Voting yes were Greer, Sheeder, Adams, Roe and Teel. Motion carried. Motion was then made by Roe and seconded by Teel to suspend the rules, waive the second and third readings and adopt Ordinance #363. Voting to approve were Adams, Sheeder, Teel, Greer and Roe. Motion carried. This will be published as quickly as possible and the additional signs erected.

Public input was asked for. The new signs were discussed with Dwain Bollman, Public Works Director. Also discussed was the D.O.T.'s letter of the speed limit on Highway 22; all the rainwater runoff going downhill in the westend of town; culverts under the highway; riverfront lighting; trespassers on a rental property; ways to contact the police officer on duty.

Motion was made by Roe and seconded by Sheeder to adjourn the meeting at 10:28 a.m. All voted aye. Motion carried.
