The new City Council of Buffalo, IA, met in regular session on Monday, January 03, 2000, at City Hall at 7:29 p.m. with Mayor Phil Hoover presiding. Councilmembers present were Todd Adams, Mitch Greer, Dave Kimes, Bill Sheeder and Ted Teel.

Motion was made by Sheeder and Adams to approve Resolution #01-2000, "A RESOLUTION TO APPOINT A MAYOR PRO TEM". Voting yes were Adams, Greer, Kimes, Teel and Sheeder. Motion carried. Ted Teel is Mayor ProTem until May 31, 2000.

Motion was made by Greer and Teel to approve Resolution #02-2000, "A RESOLUTION TO RETAIN CITY EMPLOYEES". All members voted yes. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Adams and Greer to approve Resolution #03-2000, "A RESOLUTION TO DESIGNATE THE CITY DEPOSITORIES". All members voted yes. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Teel and Greer to approve Resolution #04-2000, "A RESOLUTION DESIGNATING COMMITTEES AND BOARDS". All members voted yes. Motion carried.

Ronda McCreight was not present to give the Buffalo Days report. Motion was made by Greer and Sheeder to table the funds for fireworks until she is at the next meeting. All ayes. Carried.


Mark Smith from "Camp Abe Lincoln" in Buffalo, <sup>was here</sup> to discuss community support and usage of a new proposed swimming pool and bath houses at the Camp. A new pool would have a one hundred person capacity at any time and would be larger than the present one, and will not have a diving area. He will update us when plans are finalized.


Motion was made by Greer and Teel to allow the Mayor and Clerk to attend the two IMFOA meetings this year. All ayes. Carried.

The Finance/Ordinance Committee will meet on January 17 at 6:00 p.m. at City Hall. The Sewer/Water Committee will meet on January 07 at 9:00 a.m. in the Morton Bldg. The Electric/Street Committee will meet on January 07 at 5:00 p.m. at the Morton Bldg. The Personnel/Employee Relations Committee will meet on January 27 at 6:00 p.m.

Public input was asked for. Greer asked about the trash hauler and a list of items that they pick up and about a number for items such as furniture, etc. Steve Honse of Veenstra & Kimm, Inc. introduced himself and the company to the Mayor and Council. Rick Sizenbach from the Buffalo Volunteer Ambulance Service was here for the water tower antennae they wish to have installed. The clerk had contacted the city attorney about this item before typing the agenda and their attorney and insurance agent had not been in contact with him yet, so he felt there was no need for this item. A special meeting for the ambulance antennae will be on January 06 at 5:00 p.m. for this item only. Teel talked of signs that could be put along Front Street directing people to the city offices. Barb Britcher wants a sign at the end of the alley behind her home warning of small children playing there, and asked why the streets in that part of town were not plowed. Bollman said the hills and intersections were salted and plowed, but not the east/west streets.

Motion was made by Adams and Teel to adjourn the meeting at 8:33 p.m. All voted aye. Motion carried.
