

The City Council of Buffalo, IA, met in regular session on Monday, October 09, 2000, at 7:00 p.m. with Mayor Phil Hoover presiding at City Hall. Councilmembers present were Mitch Greer, David Kimes, Bill Sheeder and Ted Teel.

Mayor led the Pledge of Allegiance and 15 seconds to reflect.

Community Center report was given by Lynn Kinkennon. New roof was put on building. Refrigerator went down, called repairman. Bingo doing good.

Motion was made by Sheeder, seconded by Greer to approve the minutes of September 11 and 26. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Greer, seconded by Sheeder to approve the payment of the listed bills. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Greer, seconded by Sheeder to approve the Treasurers report. All ayes. Motion carried. Receipts for Sept. were \$88,777.66 and Disbursements were \$96,220.30.

Motion was made by Teel, seconded by Sheeder to accept the resignation of Todd Adams, councilmember. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Sheeder, seconded by Teel to approve the second reading of Ordinance #369, "AN ORDINANCE FOR EXCAVATIONS-WARNING MARKERS-RESTORATION." Voting yes were Kimes Greer, Sheeder and Teel. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Teel, seconded by Kimes to approve Resolution #29-2000, "A RESOLUTION SETTING A CLASSIFICATION AND PAY SCALE FOR OFFICE AND PUBLIC WORKS PERSONNEL FOR THE CITY OF BUFFALO, IA." Voting yes were Kimes, Sheeder, Teel and Greer. Motion carried.

The Public Works report was given by Mayor Phil Hoover. Dwain Bollman was absent. Water problem at westend, turned over to Bob Black. He will be getting back with us and also called Iowa One Call. Mayor has an appointment with DNR from Des Moines to discuss the water and sewer issue going on at west front street, river side, the meeting is Oct. 18th. Received flyer today, from DNR, Des Moines, we have a revolving loan going on with the treatment plant project, there is also one that came out new that has to be submitted by Dec. 4th, with our drinking water. The barge is gone. River will be dredged and sand will be put on the beach.

The Police Report was given by Gage Adams, Police Chief. Officers last month received 8 hours of training at sheriffs office. Did the traffic enforcement program again. Will be setting up a meeting with the employee relations committee.

There was no committee reports. Taken care during the meeting. Donna Roe ask mayor at this time how do you go about getting on the park board. A resolution will be made up at the next council meeting to have her appointed to the park board.

Barb Britcher gave the Park Board report. Hired someone to lay the drainage tile in the park. America Corp group will be here Tuesday at 9:00 a.m. to start cleaning up the river front. Railroad ties will be removed off the beach by the railroad.

Areas on the resolution were left blank, whoever the person is that is appointed to the council seat, due to the resignation of Todd Adams will fill these vacancies until such a time that we either have an election and the winner of the election will fill these vacancies.

Motion was made by Greer, seconded by Teel to approve Resolution #31, "A RESOLUTION TO APPOINT A MAYOR PRO TEM." Voting yes were Sheeder, Teel, Greer and Kimes. Motion carried. Mayor Pro-Tem is David Kimes, November 01, 2000 thru March 31, 2001.



Voting yes were Sheeder, Kimes, Greer and Teel. Motion carried. A petition with 55 qualified signatures of Buffalo residents were presented to the mayor, city council and deputy clerk at 7:37 p.m. calling for a special election to fill the vacancy on the city council created by the resignation of Todd Adams. The Scott County Auditor will be notified Tuesday, Oct. 10, 2000 to prepare all the necessary details for the special election.


Mayor Hoover gave his report. America Corp group is coming down Tuesday to clean up the river front. Wed. night is the meeting at the arsenal about the barges. Trick or Treat night is Monday, Oct. 30th, 5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. Will meet with DNR on Oct. 18th to discuss the sewer and water problem on west front street on the river side. Will look over the committee list and amend where it is need.

Special committee meetings were scheduled. Ordinance/Finance Committee will meet Wed, Oct. 18, 2000, 6:00 p.m., at city hall. Gage will get with Employee Relations Committee to set up a date and time for the police.

Public input was asked for. Cathy Stowe commented on how the park at the westend looks nice. Fence at the park, westend, is still falling over. Bus stop at Oak and Chestnut, trash bin gone. Will be replaced with a new one.

Motion was made by Greer, seconded by Sheeder to adjourn the meeting at 7:52 p.m. All ayes. Motion carried.
