The City Council of Buffalo, Iowa, met in regular session on Monday, October 01, 2001, at 7:00 p.m. City Hall with Mayor Phil Hoover presiding. Councilmembers present were Mitch Greer, Dave Kimes, Kent Roe and Bill Sheeder. Absent, Ted Teel.

The Pledge of Allegiance was given and time reflection.

Motion was made by Roe, seconded by Sheeder to approve the minutes of September 10. All ayes. Absent, Teel. Motion carried.

There was no Treasurers report due to not having all the receipts.

There was no one present for the Community Center report.

Motion was made by Greer, seconded by Roe to approve the second reading of Ordinance #373, "AN ORDINANCE TO PRESCRIBE MINIMUM STANDARDS FOR CONSTRUCTION OF STREETS". Voting yes were Roe, Sheeder, Greer and Kimes. Absent, Teel. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Sheeder, seconded by Greer to approve the second reading of Ordinance #374, "AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE USE OF SKATEBORARDS ON SIDEWALKS IN THE CITY PARKS". Voting yes were Kimes, Greer, Roe and Sheeder. Absent, Teel. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Roe, seconded by Greer to approve Resolution #27-2001, "A RESOLUTION FOR A PUBLIC HEARING ON VACATION OF RIGHT-OF-WAY ALONG COON HUNTERS ROAD FOR THE NEW BUFFALO SCHOOL". Voting yes were Sheeder, Kimes, Roe and Greer. Absent, Teel. Motion carried.

Park Board report was asked for. There was no meeting for Sept. Will meet in Oct. Dwain has someone coming on Monday to work on the beach. If someone from the Park Board could mark out some places where they would like park benches at. Mayor received info on a program from MidAmerica on planting trees in the parks. Like Park Board to look over.

Dwain Bollman gave the Public Works report. The project at the WWTP is just about completed. Some landscaping needs to be completed, black topping, fence, gate and the control panel needs to be built and installed. Flood of 2001, met with FEMA on paper work. Received a check today for \$64,357.10, reimbursed for money the city spent on the flood. The DNR made their annual inspection of the WWTP. Delivered the temporary National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit. Gave update on this. Roe asked about ditches being put in on Franklin Street, water run off problem. Motion was made by Roe, seconded by Greer to allow the public works director to do further study and recommendations on water run off problems on both sides of Franklin Street. All ayes. Absent, Teel. Motion carried. Electric problem at new school site was discussed. Dwain working on this issue.

The Police report was given by Chief Gage Adams.

The Committee reports were covered during the meeting.

Mayor Hoover gave a brief report. Items he had were taken care of during the meeting.

Set dates for special meetings. Public Hearing set for the regular council meeting Nov. 5th. Employee Relations Committee will meet this month. Will be posted when have date and time. Mayor will meet Thursday, Oct. 4th, with attorneys for closing on the property for the new fire station. If any other meetings are needed will contact city clerk.

Motion was made by Roe, seconded by Sheeder to adjourn the meeting at 7:23 p.m. All ayes. Absent, Teel. Motion carried
