

It was explained this would begin at 6th & Franklin and go North and culverts will be placed in the driveways. Motion made by Roe and Sheeder to approve the street work. All voted aye. Motion carried.

Motion made by Roe and Sheeder to approve Resolution #30-01, "A RESOLUTION FOR VACATION OF RIGHT OF WAY FOR THE NEW SCHOOL". On a roll call vote, all voted yes. Motion carried.

Public input was asked for. Patty Teel asked if there are ordinances regulating recreational vehicles in the City? There are some, but the Code book would have to be checked.

Motion made by Roe and Kimes to adjourn the meeting at 5:42 p.m. All ayes. Carried.
