The City Council of Buffalo, IA, met on April 05, 2004, at 6:19 p.m. at City Hall with Mayor Walters presiding. Councilmembers present were Greer, Hammons, Smith, Stowe, Thein. The Pledge of Allegiance was given. Hammons left for a few minutes and returned at 6:25 p.m.

Motion was made by Stowe and Greer to approve the minutes of March 01 and 10. All present voted aye. Carried.

Motion was made by Stowe and Thein to approve the bills. All present voted aye. Motion carried.

There was no public input. Motion was made by Stowe and Thein to approve the liquor license renewal for the Beach Pub. All present voted aye. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Thein and Greer to allow the fire chief to dispose of the 1980 fire truck that had been advertised for bids. Voting yes were Greer, Thein, Smith and Hammons. Voting no, Stowe. Motion carried.

Denise Bulat from Bi-State Regional Commission explained to everyone what membership covers and services available.

Public Works report was given. Motion was made by Thein and Stowe to allow Bollman to get references for the roofing job at the Activity Center and then have him decide on which bid to accept. All voted aye. Carried.

Motion was made by Stowe and Thein to table to next years budget the hiring of someone for the rental inspectors job, but then the motion was rescinded. Motion was then made by Thein and Stowe to have Bi-State do a feasibility study on rental inspection fees. All ayes. Carried.

Motion was made by Greer and Hammons to allow the librarian to use and maintain the grass and patio enclosed area at the Activity Center that is accessible thru the library. All voted aye. Carried.

Motion was made by Stowe and Thein to approve the Parents Club to operate the concession stand during the baseball season this summer. All ayes. Carried.

Motion was made by Stowe and Greer to verify that the income from the sale of signs on the new fence at the park is to go to the Parents Club. All voted aye. Carried.

Motion was made by Stowe and Thein to approve the second reading of Ordinance #385, "AN ORDINANCE FOR SCOOTERS....." Voting yes were Stowe, Thein, Hammons, Greer and Smith. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Stowe and Thein to approve the 3rd and final reading and adopt Ordinance #386, "AN ORDINANCE INCREASING FEES FOR ZONING, VARIANCE, APPEAL MEETINGS, ETC.". Voting yes were Hammons, Thein, Greer, Stowe and Smith. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Stowe and Greer to approve the first reading of Ordinance #387, "AN ORDINANCE INCREASING THE FEES FOR PEDDLERS LICENSES". Voting yes were Greer, Smith, Hammons, Stowe and Smith. Carried.

Motion was made by Smith and Greer to approve the first reading of Ordinance #388, "AN ORDINANCE CHANGING THE REGULAR MEETING TIME TO 7:00 P.M.". Voting yes were Smith, Greer, Hammons, Thein. Voting no, Stowe. Motion carried. Motion was made by Smith and Greer to waive the rules, suspend the 2nd and 3rd readings and adopt Ordinance #388. Voting yes were Smith, Greer, Hammons and Thein. Voting no, Stowe. Motion carried. Clerk told Council this was on the agenda for only the first reading.

Motion was made by Thein and Stowe to approve Resolution #15-2004, "A RESOLUTION FOR WAGES". All voted yes on a roll call vote. Carried.

The Ordinance Committee will meet on April 07 at 5:00 p.m. at City Hall.

Public input was given at the end of the meeting by several residents.

Motion was made by Stowe and Greer to adjourn the meeting at 8:20 p.m. All voted aye.
