The City Council of Buffalo, IA, met in regular session on December 06, 2004, at 7:00 p.m. at City Hall with Mayor Walters presiding. Councilmembers present were Carson, Greer, Stowe and Wiese. Absent, Hammons.

The Pledge of Allegiance was given. Motion was made by Greer and Stowe to approve the minutes of November 01. All present voted aye. Carried.

Motion was made by Stowe and Carson to approve the bills. All present voted aye. Motion carried. Public input was given by residents on several agenda items. The public works report was given by Dwain Bollman. Motion was made by Stowe and Carson to approve the Winter Maintenance Agreement with Scott County to clear our rural streets this winter. All voted aye. Motion carried. Motion was made by Carson and Greer to install a new lock on the North door at the B.A.C. to make easier access for the workers at the food pantry. All ayes. Carried.

Motion was made by Greer and Stowe to approve the renewal of the Community Centers liquor license. All present voted aye. Carried. Motion was made by Carson and Stowe to approve the renewal of Caseys Store beer license upon receipt of their paper work. All present voted aye. Carried.

Motion was made by Carson and Wiese to approve Resolution #36-2004, "A RESOLUTION REGARDING HOUSING CODE FEE SCHEDULE". Voting yes were Carson, Stowe, Greer and Wiese. Absent, Hammons. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Carson and Stowe to approve Resolution #37-2004, "A RESOLUTION REGARDING ROSE HILL CEMETERY'S CEES AND REGULATIONS". Voting yes were Wiese, Greer, Carson and Stowe. Absent, Hammons. Motion carried.

The employees annual bonus was discussed on the motion of Stowe and Greer. Voting not to approve it were all members on a roll call vote. Absent, Hammons. Carried. Motion was then made by Carson and Greer to give all full time employees 3 days off with pay and part time employees 1½ days off with pay, to use at their discretion any time during the next one year period, effective now. All voted yes on a roll call vote. Absent, Hammons. Motion carried.

The police report was given by Gage Adams. There was no one present for the Community Center report. The Park Board report was given by Ben Gerischer. Mayor Walters gave her report.

The issue of copying all building permits for all Councilmembers was discussed. At Mayor Walters request, motion was made by Stowe and Greer to stop copying them, as they are public information and can be viewed as necessary. All voted aye. Carried.

As Mayor Walters has obtained a riverboat grant for purchase of tables, chairs and carts for the gymnasium at the B.A.C., the shipping expense must be paid by the City. Motion was made by Greer and Stowe to use some option tax funds for the shipping fee. All voted aye. Absent, Hammons. Motion carried.

Mayor discussed the Iowa Mutual Aid Compact with the Council. There were no committee reports. The date for the Park Board meeting is set for December 19 at 6:00 p.m. at City Hall. Public input was given at the end of the meeting. Motion was made by Stowe and Greer to adjourn the meeting at 8:31 p.m. All present voted aye. Absent, Hammons. Motion carried.
