The City Council of Buffalo, IA, met in regular session on August 08, 2005, at 7:00 p.m. with Mayor Walters presiding. Councilmembers present were Carson, Greer, Hammons, Wiese. Absent, Stowe. The Pledge of Allegiance was given.

Motion was made by Carson and Wiese to approve the July minutes with the correction requested by the clerk. All ayes. Carried. (They are as follows: Motion made by Stowe and Carson to discuss complying with the D.N.R. stormwater permit and having Leo Foley of Veenstra & Kimm Engineers do the project. All voted yes on a roll call vote. Carried. Motion made by Carson and Hammons for discussion on spill prevention, at a cost of \$2,000 by Veenstra & Kimm. All voted yes on a roll call vote. Carried.)

Motion made by Carson and Hammons to discuss bills and put the date on each sheet. All ayes. Carried.

Motion made by Carson and Hammons to approve the agenda. All ayes. Carried.

Motion made by Wiese and Hammons to discuss Resolution #12-2005, "A RESOLUTION REGARDING CITY HALL COMMITTEE." All ayes. Carried. Wiese then made a motion to approve Resolution #12-2005. As there was no second, Wiese withdrew her motion. Motion made by Hammons and Greer to amend the resolution. All ayes. Carried. Motion made by Hammons and Greer to approve the resolution as amended. All voted yes on a roll call vote. Absent, Stowe. Carried.

Motion made by Hammons and Greer to table Resolution #13-2005 until the September meeting. All ayes. Carried.

Motion was made by Carson and Hammons that another letter be sent to residents who have a swimming pool on their property without a proper fence and locked gate that is 24" or deeper that they must immediately either drain them or put the fence and gates up immediately. This is regulation per the Uniform Building Code. All voted yes on a roll call vote. Absent, Stowe. Carried.

Motion was made by Greer and Hammons to approve Resolution #13-2005, "A RESOLUTION DECLARATION FOR WAGES FOR 2005-2006." All voted yes on a roll call vote. Carried.

Motion was made by Hammons and Carson to discuss a public address system for City Hall. Motion was made by Hammons and Greer to table it to the September meeting. All ayes. Carried. Absent, Stowe.

Motion was made by Hammons and Wiese to discuss utility deposits. All ayes. Carried.

Motion was made by Hammons and Greer to waive the deposit fee for Bert Dyer and return it. All voted yes on a roll call vote. Absent, Stowe. Carried.

Motion made by Hammons and Greer to send it to the ordinance committee that no senior citizens from Buffalo have to pay a deposit.

Motion by Greer and Carson that police officers Gage Adams receive a \$1.00 an hour additional raise, that Terry Behning receive a \$1.00 an hour additional raise, and that Terry Ferkel receive a \$1.00 an hour additional raise, retroactive to July 11, that was voted on July 11. All voted yes. Absent, Stowe. Carried. Motion made by Greer and Carson to clarify from July 11 meeting that Rich Aleksiejczyk get an increase to \$13.50 an hour, James Morrissey get increased to \$13.25 an hour, and Robert Mackie get increased to \$13.00 an hour, and any new part time officers start at \$13.00 an hour, effective July 11. All ayes. Carried.

Motion made by Carson and Greer to schedule a fall citywide cleanup, bringing items to the curb to be picked up by the City. All present voted aye. Absent, Stowe. Carried.

Motion was made by Greer and Carson to extend the meeting to 9:15 p.m. All present aye. Absent, Stowe. Carried.

Motion was made by Carson and Wiese to extend the meeting to 9:30 p.m. All present voted aye. Absent, Stowe. Carried.

Motion was made by Greer and Carson to adjourn the meeting at 9:30 p.m. All present aye. Absent, Stowe. Motion carried.
