## CLERK'S CORNER

Where did the summer go? About the time we got air conditioning installed at City Hall, the hot weather was over... Oh well ~ just wait till next year!

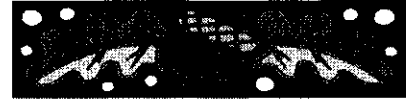
It's been a very busy month here at City Hall ~ Council now requires 2 evaluations per year for each employee, authorized work on Y-40 and Y-48, adopted a series of requirements for Stormwater and Erosion Control, authorized the purchase of a new computer and new truck for DPW, approved the annual Street Finance Report and State Financial Report, approved the painting of the Water Tower, authorized a trial fall leaf pickup, altered the building code to use the International Code instead of the Uniform Code, and agreed to purchase 1% of the Electric Utility power purchases from energy generated by wind power.

The Ethanol plant project is moving along. Council adopted Resolution 2006-10, which officially supports the RISE (Revitalize Iowa's Sound Economy) grant application for the required improvements to Highway 22 and Resolution 2006-11, which supports Alter in their quest for Financial Assistance from the state for the Ethanol plant. The applications submitted state that the expected cost of the plant is \$114 million and the project will create 30 permanent full-time jobs in Buffalo paying an estimated \$1,313,020 annually in salaries.

Council discussed the use of the Buffalo Activity Center and is reviewing the plausibility of moving the Police and DPW departments to the BAC. This would allow for "one-stop-shopping" at City Hall ~ all departments would be at a single location. In addition to making city departments more accessible to our residents, it possibly could save money eliminating duplicated services that occur when multiple buildings are used. A committee has been created to review the possibilities.

Finally, we've had some complaints about animals. Please review our City Ordinance to ensure you are complying with the law. Each dog and cat must be licensed with the City. These can be purchased at the City Clerk's office. Have a great Fall and GO BEARS!

The City Council has authorized a fall leaf pickup program for the last 2 weeks of October and the first 2 weeks of November (October 16-November 10). The Public Works employees will pick up your leaves and deliver them to the compost pile at the landfill.

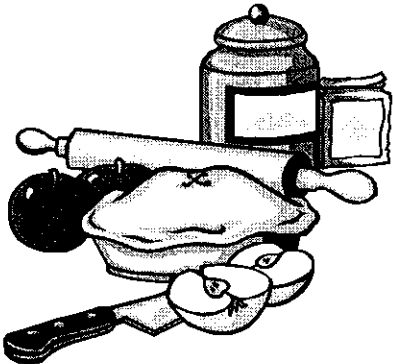

### Apple Crumb Pie Recipe

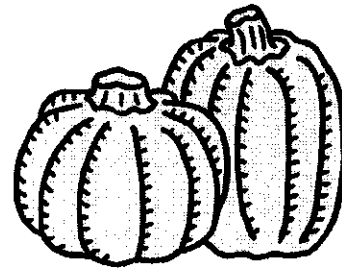

#### INGREDIENTS:

- 9-inch pastry shell, unbaked, chilled
- 1 cup sifted flour
- 1/2 cup brown sugar, firmly packed
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup soft butter
- 6 cups peeled, sliced cooking apples
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- vanilla ice cream

#### PREPARATION:

Combine flour, brown sugar, salt, and butter; blend until crumbly then set aside. Combine apples, granulated sugar, and cinnamon; mix gently to coat apple slices. Pack apple mixture into chilled crust. Sprinkle crumb topping over apples. Bake in 375° oven until apples are tender, about 50 minutes. Serve this apple pie with vanilla ice cream.

be alone.

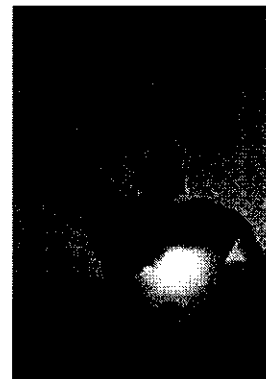
The trailboss has called, I'm
