AN ORDINANCE REPEALING AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED " AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE COMPENSATION OF OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES, PASSED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL ON MARCH 22, 1933."

SECTION, 1. Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Buffalo, Iowa, that Ordinance No. 9, entitled "An ordinance providing for the compensation of officers and employees" be, and the same is hereby repealed in its entirety, and the following enacted in lieu thereof.

SECTION, 2. The compensation of Town Officers provided in this ordinance shall be paid on the presentation of bills therefor and shall be acted upon by the Council the same as other claims upon the Town.

SECTION, 3. The Mayor shall receive a salary of Forty (\$40.00) Dollars per year, payable quarterly, and the fees of his office as fixed by ordinance or laws, provided that the Town shall in no case be liable for any fees.

SECTION 4. The Clerk shall receive One (\$1.00) Dollar for each council meeting that he attends and a salary of Three (\$3.00) Dollars for doing the necessary writing and recording resulting from each meeting, exclusive of any services rendered as clerk of the municipal lighting plant.

SECTION 5. The Treasurer shall receive a salary of Sixty-four (\$64.00) Dollars per year, payable quarterly.

SECTION 6. The Street Commissioner, Policemen, and all other officers and employees, where no salary is fixed by ordinance, shall receive such compensation as the council shall fix by resolution.

SECTION 7. Each Councilman shall receive One (\$1.00) Dollar for each council meeting that he attends, not to exceed Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars in any one year, and he shall receive in addition to the foregoing, for services as a member of the Board of Review, an amount not to exceed One (\$1.00) Dollar for each session of said board of not less than three hours and the compensation for services as member of said board of review shall be paid out of the County Treasury on bills filed with the County Auditor.

SECTION 8, All ordinances or parts of ordinances conflicting with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 9, This ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage and publication as required by law.

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SALARY ORDINANCE.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE COMPENSATION OF OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES

Be it ordained by the Council of the Town of Buffalo, Iowa:

SECTION 1. The compensation of the officials shall be as follows and shall be paid on presentation of bills therefor, and allowance of the same by the council.

SECTION 2. The mayor shall receive a salary of six dollars and twenty-five cents (\$6.25) per quarter, and the fees of his office as fixed by ordinance or law, provided that the town shall in no case be liable for any fees.

SECTION 3. The clerk shall receive one (\$1) dollar for each council meeting that he attends and a salary of three (\$3) dollars per month for doing the necessary writing and recording resulting from the meetings of the town council exclusive of any services rendered as clerk of the municipal lighting plant.

SECTION 4. The treasurer shall receive a salary of sixty (\$60.) dollars a year, payable quarterly.

SECTION 5. The street commissioner, policemen, and all other officers and employees where no salary is fixed by ordinance shall receive such compensation as the council shall fix by resolution.

SECTION 6. Each councilman shall receive one dollar for each council meeting he attends, not to exceed fifty dollars in any one year, and he shall receive in addition to the foregoing, for services as a member of the board of review, an amount not exceeding one dollar (\$1) for each session of said board of not less than three hours, and the compensation for services as member of the board of review shall be paid out of the county treasury

on bills filed with the county auditor.

SECTION 7. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 8. This ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage and publication as provided by law.
