CHILDREN ON STREET.

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING CHILDREN FROM BEING UPON THE STREETS, ALLEYS, OR PUBLIC GROUNDS AT CERTAIN TIMES AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION.

Be it ordained by the Council of the Town of Buffalo, Iowa:

SECTION 1. That it shall be unlawful for any child under the age of sixteen years to be upon the streets, alleys, or public grounds between the hours nine o'clock P. M. and five o'clock A. M. unless accompanied by parent, guardian, or employer, or upon some errand by permission or direction of such parent, guardian, or employer and then such child shall not loiter on the way or make any undue noise by shouting or yelling or otherwise disturbing the peace.

SECTION 2. Any child who violates any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to arrest by any peace officer or by any citizen, without process. Upon such arrest, the child shall be taken and delivered into the hands of the parent, guardian, or employer of such child. Upon the second or any subsequent arrest such offender shall be taken by the officer or person making the arrest before the mayor for hearing and the mayor shall decide whether or not any information shall be filed by the marshal before the District Court of the county, charging such offender with being a delinquent child.

SECTION 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage and publication as provided by law.
