FOOL AND BOWLING.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATION AND LICENSING OF BILLIARD OR POOL TABLES KEPT FOR HIRE AND BOWLING OR TEN PIN ALLEYS, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION.

Be it ordained by the Council of the Town of Buffalo, Iowa:

SECTION 1. No person shall conduct or operate a billiard or pool table or other table kept for hire, or a bowling or ten pin alley without first procuring a license therefor, which license shall be, in addition to the mayor's fee of one (\$1.00) dollar for issuing the same, the sum of three (\$3.00) dollars per year for the first table and two (\$2.00) dollars for each additional table under the control of said person.

SECTION 2. All billiard or pool rooms and bowling or ten pin alleys shall be closed at 11 o'clock P. M. during each day of the week and shall not open before 5 o'clock A. M.

SECTION 3. The windows of all billiard or pool rooms and bowling alleys shall be free from all curtains or other obstructions so as to give a free view of the same from the street at all times.

SECTION 4. No person who keeps a billiard or pool hall or bowling or ten pin alley, nor the agent, clerk, or servant of any such person, nor any person having charge or control of any such hall or alley, shall permit any minor to remain in any such hall or alley or take part in any game known as billiards or pool or nine or ten pins.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall apply to all soft drink parlors and all places of business where one or more billiard or pool tables or bowling or ten pin alleys are kept for hire.

SECTION 6. Anyone violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be subject to imprisonment not exceeding thirty (30) days or to a fine not exceeding one hundred (\$100.00) dollars. Whenever the fine and costs imposed for the violation of this ordinance are not paid, the person convicted may be committed to jail until the fine and costs are paid, not to exceed thirty (30) days.

SECTION 7. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 8. This ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage and publication as provided by law.
