

ORDINANCE NUMBER 132

DOGS

ORDINANCE PROHIBITING OWNERS OF ALL DOGS FROM ALLOWING SAID DOGS TO RUN AT LARGE WITHIN THE INCORPORATED LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF BUFFALO, IOWA AND PRESCRIBED PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION.

Be it Ordained by the Council of the Town of Buffalo, Iowa:

Section 1. That any person shall be considered the owner of a dog, who shall own, or have in charge, or harbor the same or allow it to remain about or on his premises to exceed three (3) days.

Section 2. That the owners of all dogs shall keep said dogs confined in a suitable pen or properly tied.

Section 3. That all dogs not confined or tied shall be kept on leash when accompanying any person within the incorporated limits of the Town of Buffalo, Iowa.

Section 4. That all dogs running at large shall be disposed of by the Marshal or other person appointed by the Mayor in writing.

Section 5. That anyone violating any provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be subject to a fine of not less than Ten (\$10.00) Dollars nor more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

Whenever the fine and costs are not paid, the person convicted may be committed to jail until the fine is paid, for a period not to exceed Thirty (30) Days.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication as required by law.
