

ORDINANCE NUMBER 138

AN ORDINANCE DEFINING DISTURBANCE OF THE PEACE IN THE TOWN OF BUFFALO, IOWA, AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.

Be it ordained by the Council of the Town of Buffalo, Iowa;

Section 1. If any person make or excite any disturbance in a tavern, store, grocery, or any other places of business, or at any election or public meeting, or any other place where the citizens are peaceably and lawfully assembled, he shall be guilty of disturbing the peace.

Section 2. Anyone found guilty of violating this ordinance, upon conviction, be subject to a fine not exceeding One Hundred Dollars (100.00) or may committed to jail until the fine and costs are paid but not to exceed thirty (30) days.

Section 3. Any Ordinance or parts of Ordinances relating to any of the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.


Section 4. This Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage and publication as required by law.
