

ORDINANCE NUMBER 143

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING ANYONE UNDER THE AGE OF TWENTY-ONE YEARS OF AGE FROM FREQUENTING A BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENT HAVING A CLASS B BEER PERMIT AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS.

SECTION ONE: It shall be unlawful for any person under Twenty-One years of age to enter, remain in, or frequent a business establishment holding a class B Beer Permit unless over 50% of the dollar volume of the business establishment comes from the sale of prepared food.

SECTION TWO: It shall be unlawful for any person operating a business establishment holding a Class B Beer Permit to allow any person under Twenty-One years of age to remain in the establishment in violation of the paragraph above.

SECTION THREE: Anyone violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall, upon conviction, be subject to imprisonment not exceeding thirty days or to a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars(\$100.00).

SECTION FOUR: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION FIVE: This Ordinance shall take effect and force from and after its passage and publication as provided by law.
