

RESOLUTION NO. 08-2000

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION TO THE IOWA DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES - STATE WATER POLLUTION CONTROL REVOLVING FUND LOAN PROGRAM FOR SANITARY SEWER PROJECTS FOR THE PURPOSE OF DESIGNING AND CONSTRUCTING SANITARY SEWERAGE SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS IN THE CITY OF BUFFALO, IOWA, DESIGNATING THE MAYOR AS THE AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE FOR ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATED WITH THE PROJECT AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE THE LOAN APPLICATION

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Buffalo, Iowa has determined that it is necessary to complete the construction of certain improvements to the wastewater treatment plant and sanitary sewer system; and

WHEREAS, the State of Iowa under its State Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund Loan Program provides for sewerage system improvements by offering low interest loans; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Buffalo, Iowa is interested in submitting an application for a low interest loan under the state program for the completing the construction of improvements to the sanitary sewer system.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Buffalo, Iowa that:


1. The State Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund loan application for construction of Wastewater Transmission and Treatment systems is hereby approved.
2. Phil Hoover, Mayor, is hereby authorized and directed to execute and file the application on behalf of the City of Buffalo, Iowa with the State of Iowa Department of Natural Resources; and that he is hereby authorized and directed to furnish such information as the Department of Natural Resources may reasonably request in connection with the application which is herein authorized to be filed, sign all necessary documents which are herein authorized, to furnish such assistants to the Iowa Department of Natural Resources as may be required by law or regulations, and to receive payment.
